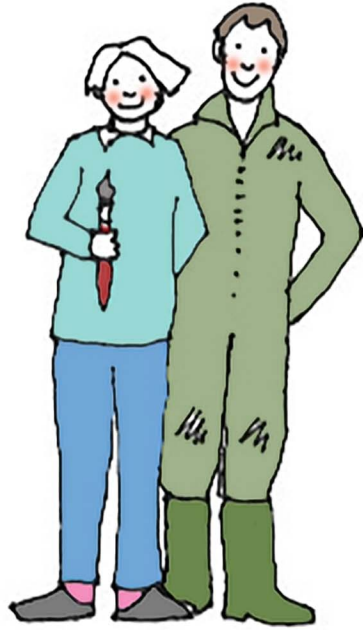


My Visit to Beechenhill Farm

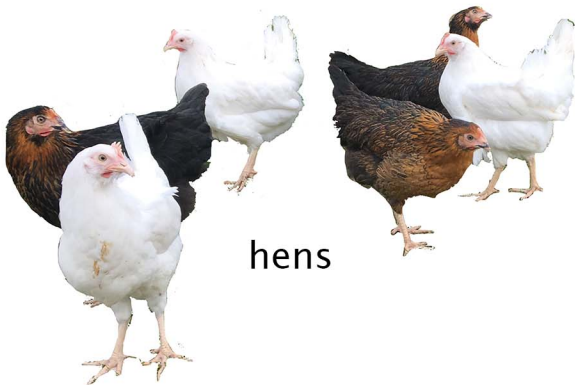


A clear and friendly guide to visiting Beechenhill Farm
